

Information Guideline

Ladies and Gentlemen,
dear Friends, dear Guests,

Despite the difficult situation worldwide and the various different restrictions in each country, the German Figure Skating Federation (DEU) has unanimously decided to organize its traditional International Competition, the “Nebelhorn-Trophy 2020”, in Oberstdorf; differently as in all previous years - without public - but for our sport. The main reasons for this decision were

- Offering the possibility of an international competition to the skaters;
- Keeping our Figure Skating sport in the sport activity calendar;
- Offering Figure Skating to the Media and pleasing the fans.

We can only succeed with our event if we fulfil the various restrictions, follow the guidelines and only if we have your full cooperation in this regard. We are trying to summarize some of the most important rules to make not only your trip to Oberstdorf safe and healthy, but also your stay and the competition successful.

Most important

The most important guidelines are

- **Keep the distances of 1.5 m to any other individual, if not within a family clan;**
- **Wash your hands carefully and as often as possible;**
- **Wear your mask to cover mouth and nose in all indoor areas.**

Arrival by Plane

Arriving from a “safe” country is different than arriving from a “Covid-19 Hotspot” or a “country of a higher risk”. Depending on the actual situation, a test at the airport upon arrival might be necessary.

Travel to Oberstdorf

The easiest way today is travelling by car. However, if travelling by plane is necessary, we recommend to use one of our individual bus transportation from Munich airport to Oberstdorf, rather than taking the train. The bus goes directly to the final destination, can offer the necessary distances of the persons and is not crowded compared to any train or train station. Members of our team will help everyone at the airport to find the waiting buses. The costs would be € 50,00 per person.

Buses will run at a specific time (hour). If a small waiting time is necessary, please ensure you keep the distances towards other people in the airport and wear your mask.

Our team members at the airport will note your name and country to be able to track if needed.

You need to wear your mask during the bus trip.

Arrival in Oberstdorf

Irrespective if teams or individuals arrive in Oberstdorf, please contact the Organizing Committee as soon as possible for accreditation. The accreditation is located in the "Skating Arena" and well signed. At the accreditation we will take your name, address and phone number. The individual ID-passes will include your own seat in the arena, where you need to sit during events and practice to make sure that there is the required way and distance towards other persons. Special ways will be marked as "one-way-roads", etc.

We also provide a separate brochure onsite about all special arrangements made for the event.

Chaperons will need to purchase a so called "all event permit", which costs € 65.00 per person. Such a permit allows to enter practice and competitions, will include an individual seat in the arena and a guideline for the event. The permit does not allow to enter Rink 2, the dressing area and other internal spaces.

Arrangement in the Skating Arena

The following arrangements have been made in the arena, for both practices and competition:

- Skaters will be assigned for the various dressing rooms, depending on their activities
- Access of people to the Skating Lounge is limited; only limited self-service is allowed
- Masks have to be worn at all times in the arena, except when skating
- Special arrangements will be made for draws, meetings, etc.
- A medical doctor has been assigned for "Questions and Answers, Tests etc." around the Covid-19 pandemic
- One way routes are created to guide the internal traffic
- Individual seats for every accredited person
- Limited access for chaperons during practice

No public will be allowed to the competition and practice.

Media

The event will be live streamed throughout the world. The event will also be shown in Japan through TV Asahi.
